## FROM THE OFFICE

Welcome Home to our seasonal residents making their way back south.

When you stop by the office upon your arrival, please welcome Sylvia, our new manager. For those of you that may not already know, Kay retired after 17 wonderful years with us here at Arcadia Village. We certainly miss her and we wish her the best. Sylvia has been working diligently thru the summer to get her arms around Arcadia Village.

### A few things to note:

- Tree trimming will be the week of October 21st. If you would like to be included, please stop by the office and notify Sylvia with your \$25 payment.
- Stove at Cantina has been replaced, and an additional oven added.
- Water turn-ons are only done during business hours and only when you (or your designated representative) are present inside the home to check for any leaks. Please schedule accordingly with the office.
- Office hours are now 8:00 am—4:30 pm M-F.

### Rules & Regulations Reminders:

- **Guests** need to be registered with the office and must carry a guest pass at all times when in the park. (If you have a 1-day guest, stop in the office during business hours (8:00a-4:30p—Monday thru Friday) if your guest wants to be able to use any of the amenities with you.
- **Golf Carts:** Rules state that anyone driving a motorized vehicle or a golf cart must be old enough and must possess a valid driver's license. Please remember this rule is in place for everyone's safety.
- **Speeding:** The Speed Limit in Arcadia Village is 15 miles per hour. This includes golf carts and any other motorized vehicles. If you see any outside vendors or delivery vehicles speeding, please report to the office with make, model and color of vehicle, as well as the license plate number, company name, vehicle number, etc. The more information we have the better chance of getting resolution.
- **Maintenance:** Do not forget that you are responsible for the maintenance of the outside of your home, weeds, plants, trees, house washing, and if you currently occupy a storage space it must be

kept trimmed and neat as well all 12 months of the year. We thank you in advance for your corporation.

- **Resident Information Update:** Please be sure to update the office with any change of information (phone numbers, northern addresses, emails, etc). This helps greatly if we need to reach any residents for any reason, emergency or otherwise.
- **Renters:** must be approved by management. Please pickup an application at our office.

## ARCADIA VILLAGE STORAGE AREA RULES & REGULATIONS

The storage area is still first-come-first-served, with a limited number of spaces. It works best when everyone utilizing the area takes no more space than absolutely necessary.

If you currently have a spot in the storage area, please stop by the office and fill out an updated registration form. This will then get you an updated storage pass and updated set of guidelines. This will help Sylvia get the most up-to-date information on what's available and when. There is currently a waiting list of residents looking for some storage space. If you no longer need your space, please let the office know ASAP so that others may take advantage of this area while they need it. If you were on the waiting list, you would appreciate others' cooperation in this matter.

The storage area is for RV's, motor homes, boats, trailers and other limited vehicles approved by management. This area is not for guest parking. Guests can park in your driveway or at the Cantina/Siesta parking lot during their limited visit time.

If you have something small to store, please consider pairing up with someone that might have a little extra space in their area. This helps in freeing up areas and making sure all space is utilized.

When a resident comes to the front office and requests a space, they will be added to a wait list. When a space becomes available we will contact you to see if you are still interested or in need of a spot. If you cannot be reached after 2 attempts we will move to the next person on the list.

## **RESIDENTS OF A STORAGE SPACE ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE FOLLOWING RULES:**

- ◇ Space may only be occupied by: RV, Motor Home, Boat, Trailer, other limited vehicle approved by office management.
- ◇ Enclosures/structures of any kind are not allowed.
- ◇ Space must be kept trimmed and weed free 12-months of the year.
- ◇ Space is not to be used for parking of cars or visiting guest parking
- ◇ All vehicles in storage spaces must have the parking permit displayed on the vehicle. If you change vehicles and need a new parking permit, it is your responsibility to contact the office to update vehicle type and obtain new permit sticker.
- ◇ All items in the storage area must have current registration/license tags.

Any storage areas not occupied for extended periods of time after season starts (typically October 1<sup>st</sup>) will be notified that the spot will be reclaimed by management.

Any storage area that is not maintained, trimmed, or kept free of miscellaneous junk and/or debris will be corrected by management and resident will either be billed or management reserves the right to reclaim and offer to the next person on the waiting list.

If there are no spots available, there are plenty of storage facilities within a short drive of Arcadia that may be willing to accommodate your vehicles for a nominal fee.

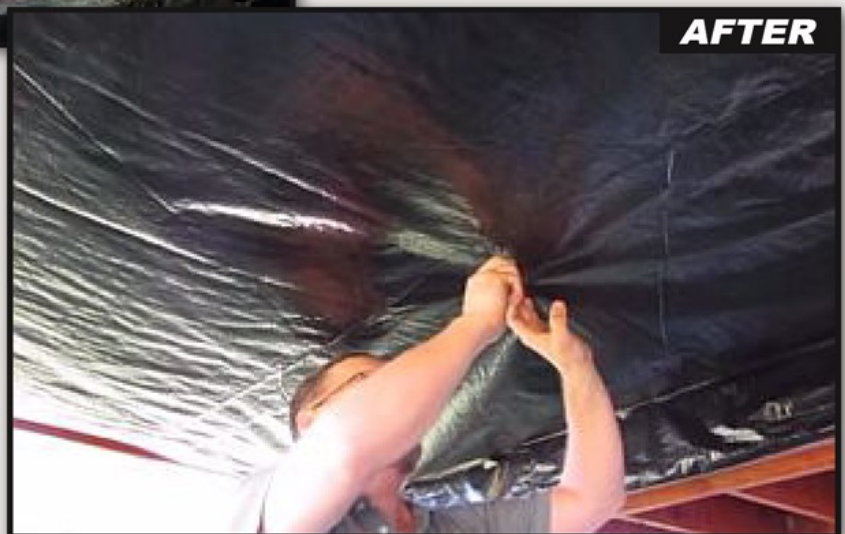

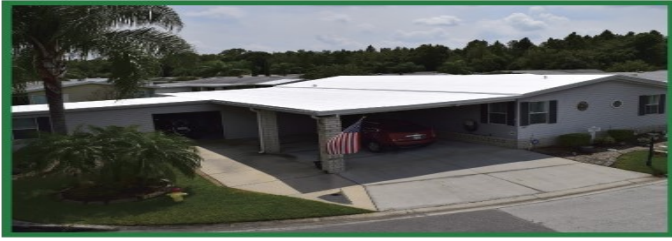

The pumpkins are carved, the costumes are prepared and there's a big bowl of candy waiting by the door — if it lasts until Oct 31, that is. Halloween is lurking in the wings, ready to swoop down for another night of trick-or-treating, haunted houses and frights for all. But where did these annual rituals come from? Read on to find out...



The church tried to change this by encouraging people to hand out food to the poor on All Souls' Day. In exchange for "soul" cakes, the poor promised to pray for the dead relatives of the people who gave them the cakes. Soon, children were dressing up and begging for cakes, too.

By the 1920s, the children in America began trick-or-treating as a harmless way of involving everyone in town in the holiday. Back then, tricks

like turning over out-houses and soaping the windows were widespread, especially if a house wasn't giving out treats.

### How did Halloween start?

About 2,000 years ago, the Celts celebrated the end of their year on Oct. 31. Their new year started the next day, but for that one night, the Celts believed that the line between the living and the dead blurred and that people who were dead could come back to walk the Earth.

The Celts, who lived in Ireland, the United Kingdom and northern France, celebrated with bonfires and wore costumes for the festival called Samhain, pronounced sow-in or sown (rhymes with clown).

In A.D. 43, the Celts were overrun by the Romans, who ruled during the next 400 years and combined two of their fall festivals with Samhain. In late October, the Romans remembered their dead on Ferialia and then honored Pomona, the Roman goddess of fruit and trees. Supposedly, this is why we bob for apples on Halloween.

### Why is it called Halloween?

By the 800s, Christianity had appeared in the area and Pope Boniface IV wanted to replace the pagan festivals with Christian holidays. But it didn't work exactly the way he expected. The Catholic Church decided to honor all saints on Nov. 1 and later named Nov. 2 All Souls' Day to remember the dead. All Saints' Day was called All hallows, so the night before (Oct. 31) was All hallows Eve, which was celebrated with bonfires and costumes.

### Why do people hand out treats?

The Celts (and their descendants) left food in front of their homes because they believed the dead would eat and then not need to come inside the house.

### How come the United States celebrates?

The people in colonial America immigrated from Europe and brought their customs with them. These were combined with some from the American Indians. Scary pagan rituals were discouraged, and the holiday became sort of a fall festival to celebrate the harvest. There were ghost stories and mischief, too.

### Why do people wear costumes?

The Celts and later the Europeans, believing that the spirits walked the Earth on Oct. 31, wore masks after dark so that if they should run into a ghost, the spirit would think the wanderer was one of their own and not try to possess the body.

### What's up with the jack-o'-lantern?

An Irish legend tells the tale of Stingy Jack, who played tricks on the devil. When Jack got to heaven, he wasn't welcome; he wasn't welcome by the devil, either. So Jack had to wander the Earth forever. Because he couldn't see in the dark, he carved out a turnip or potato and put in a lump of coal he stole from the devil.

When the Irish people immigrated to America, they brought the legend and the tradition of the carved potatoes and turnips with them. Pumpkins were easier to carve and there were a lot of them in America, so they soon took the place of the turnips and potatoes.

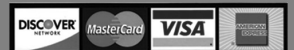

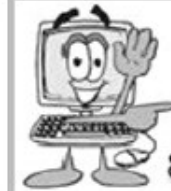

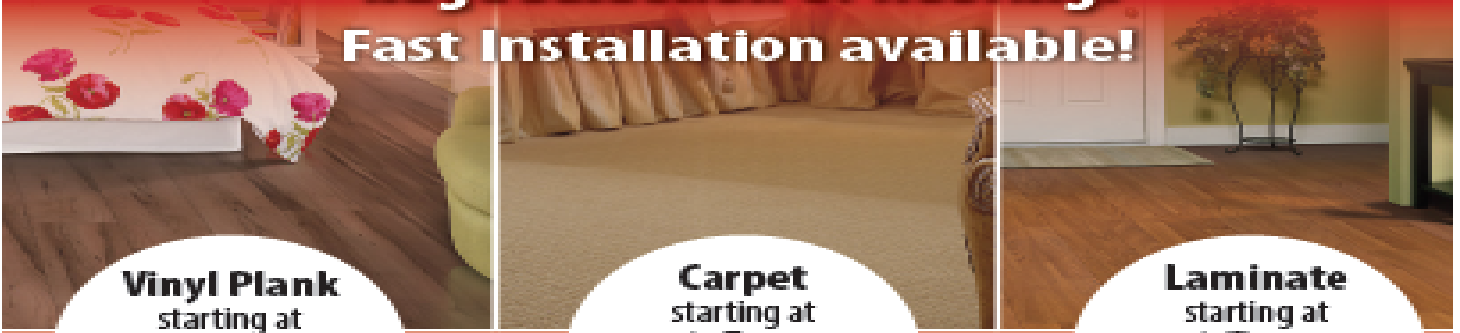
