Fast Bikers:

AV Management has personally visited and spoken to all the surrounding parks' management personnel about fast bikers in our park. If any resident has definitive information regarding where these fast bikers are originating from, please share with the office. We are not trying to discourage all biking in AV, only the transient fast bikers occasionally seen in the community. If you happen to speak with them, please get as much information as possible and we will follow up from there based on the information received.

Signage / Speed Bumps:

The office has been upgrading speed bumps, street signs, and stop signs throughout the park. This is an ongoing improvement. Please be mindful of your fellow residents when traveling through the community, be courteous to each other.

Improvements to Lots:

Remember any improvements to your property (structures, additions, pavers, concrete, landscaping (beyond simple flowers) must be approved through the office **PRIOR** to commencement of work. Please bring a simple drawing of improvements you are considering and we can review guidelines with you at that time. This helps protect underground utilities that may be affected by any work done. It's also a reminder of when a permit may be required.

Inspections in January:

Park Management will again be driving around toward the end of January for inspections, we are checking on maintenance requirements as stated in the Rules and Regulations. Homes clean from mold and mildew (all sides), outside storage of articles in compliance, carports clean of stains/spills, landscape maintenance; trimmed and mowed edged, residents hand watering only.

There are many changes coming to the HOA, we have rescinded the By-laws, and made the 2016 By-laws the legal By-laws that we should be using. This means that we will no longer be responsible for any committees monies. They have been returned to all the committees that the treasurer was holding in the HOA account. Presently the annual dues will go back to \$5.00 per house. We will be setting up a By-laws committee and once we have gone through Statue 723 we will bring our proposals before the membership.

Again, we would like to thank the outgoing Board Members Jay Cramer, Lynda Emery and Greg Owen for the time on the board.

We would also like to remind everyone that if we do not support our Entertainment Committee and other committees that spend endless hours setting up and running shows and dances and everything else, that eventually

we will be the ultimate losers. We can not afford to continue to lose money on shows. Michael D'Amour was a great singer and entertainer yet we were not able to draw enough people into the show to cover the cost we paid him. The turn out for the Arcadia Chorus was wonderful. Many people came and enjoyed the songs. We have events coming up that we ask all residents of Arcadia Village to come out and enjoy. There are dances, ie: New Year's Eve Dance, another entertainer, this time a ventriloquist and comedian, more musicians coming in January and so much more. January 1 Becomes New Year's Day

The early Roman calendar consisted of 10 months and 304 days, with each new year beginning at the vernal equinox; according to tradition, it was created by Romulus, the founder of Rome, in the eighth century B.C. A later king, Numa Pompilius, is credited with adding the months of Januarius and Februarius. Over the centuries, the calendar fell out of sync with the sun, and in 46 B.C. the emperor Julius Caesar decided to solve the problem by consulting with the most prominent astronomers and mathematicians of his time. He introduced the Julian calendar, which closely resembles the more modern Gregorian calendar that most countries around the world use today.

As part of his reform, Caesar instituted January 1 as the first day of the year, partly to honor the month's namesake: Janus, the Roman god of beginnings, whose two faces allowed him to look back into the past and forward into the future. Romans celebrated by offering sacrifices to Janus, exchanging gifts with one another, decorating their homes with laurel branches and attending raucous parties. In medieval Europe, Christian leaders temporarily replaced January 1 as the first of the year with days carrying more religious significance, such as December 25 (the anniversary of Jesus' birth) and March 25 (the Feast of the Annunciation); Pope Gregory XIII reestablished January 1 as New Year's Day in 1582.

New Year's Traditions

In many countries, New Year's celebrations begin on the evening of December 31—New Year's Eve—and continue into the early hours of January 1. Revelers often enjoy meals and snacks thought to bestow good luck for the coming year. In Spain and several other Spanish-speaking countries, people bolt down a dozen grapes—symbolizing their hopes for the months ahead—right before midnight. In many parts of the world, traditional New Year's dishes feature legumes, which are thought to resemble coins and herald future financial success; examples include lentils in Italy and black-eyed peas in the southern United States. Because pigs represent progress and prosperity in some cultures, pork appears on the New Year's Eve table in Cuba, Austria, Hungary, Portugal and other countries. Ring-shaped cakes and pastries, a sign that the year has come full circle, round out the feast in the Netherlands, Mexico, Greece and elsewhere. In Sweden and Norway, meanwhile, rice pudding with an almond hidden inside is served on New Year's Eve; it is said that whoever finds the nut can expect 12 months of good fortune.

Other customs that are common worldwide include watching fireworks and singing songs to welcome the new year, including the ever-popular "Auld Lang Syne" in many English-speaking countries. The practice of making resolutions for the new year is thought to have first caught on among the ancient Babylonians, who made promises in order to earn the favor of the gods and start the year off on the right foot. (They would reportedly vow to pay off debts and return borrowed farm equipment.)

In the United States, the most iconic New Year's tradition is the dropping of a giant ball in New York City's Times Square at the stroke of midnight. Millions of people around the world watch the event, which has taken place almost every year since 1907. Over time, the ball itself has ballooned from a 700-pound iron-and-wood orb to a brightly patterned sphere 12 feet in diameter and weighing in at nearly 12,000 pounds. Various towns and cities across America have developed their own versions of the Times Square ritual, organizing public drops of items ranging from pickles (Dillsburg, Pennsylvania) to possums (Tallapoosa, Georgia) at midnight on New Year's Eve.

Hearty Vegetarian Chili

Ingredients (17) 8 servings

3 tablespoons olive oil
1 large onion (peeled and diced)
1 large carrot (peeled and diced)
2 stalks celery (diced)
1 large green pepper (diced)
1 jalapeno (seeded and diced)
4 cloves garlic (minced)
to taste salt and pepper
2 tablespoons chili powder
1 teaspoon paprika
2 teaspoons cumin
2 teaspoons dried oregano
1 28-ounce can tomatoes (with juices)
5 cups vegetable stock
1 28-ounce can red kidney beans (drained and rinsed)
1 cup fresh corn (or frozen)
add splash maple syrup



Directions

1. Heat oil in pot over medium heat. Add onions, carrots, celery, green pepper, jalapeno and garlic. Season with salt and pepper and cook until vegetables are soft.
2. Add dried spices and cook for two minutes stirring constantly.
3. Add canned tomatoes and stock. Bring to a boil and reduce heat to medium low and cook for 45 minutes, stirring occasionally.
4. Add kidney beans and corn, continue cooking for 15 minutes longer.
5. Take off heat, add maple syrup and adjust seasonings with salt and pepper.
6. To serve, ladle into bowls and garnish with fresh cilantro, cheddar cheese, sour cream, etc.

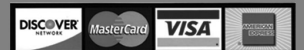

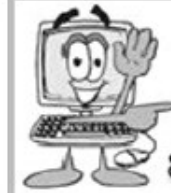

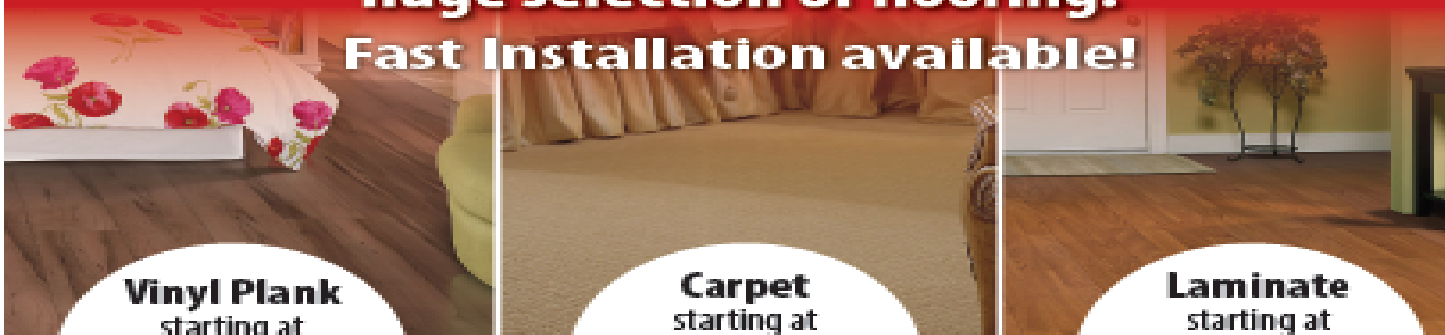
