Going Home or Staying through the summer review

Residents Home Maintenance Check List (not all-inclusive):

-weeds -plants -trees -house washing -gutters -lanai

-shed -carport -roof -windows -RV Lot

- Take a walk around your house, review you're in compliance with the Rules and Regulations. If you
 have someone that maintains your home while you're away, contact the person(s) and review your
 agreements to make sure you are taken care of for the upcoming year.
- We recommend and would appreciate anyone leaving for several weeks or month(s) put away all
 outside items that could become projectiles or fly away in high winds causing damage to your home
 and or locations around you.
- Check your outside lights, make sure they are working, non-working lights let people know you are not home. LED replacement will save on your electrical bill.
- Ropes across your driveway say you're not home, a neighbor borrowing your driveway occasionally over the summer signals someone may be home, thereby being a deterrence.
- Notify the office in a timely fashion when leaving. Make sure they have a current phone number to reach you should there be a reason. I have had many neighbors come and inform me that a neighbors AC is not turning off or they have a water leak, I attempt to call the home owner and all numbers are disconnected. A letter takes longer to reach you and damage could be worse if we do not have a current phone number in the office. In addition, let the office know what day to have your water turned off. You should be present to turn off your water heater at the same time. Please schedule ahead of time during office hours.

- *NOTE, after spraying weeds, you are to remove the dead debris within a week of spraying.
- Remember, Sprinklers are not allowed, hand water only.
- Please return Guest passes promptly so others can use them and avoid replacement charges.
- Spare Key's Have you thought of a spare key, through a neighbor, house sitter or office for any service personnel during your absence, if you have an issue and would like to give access to your home for repairs. *NOTE: If your house is listed for sale, office personnel living on-site do not have access to the keys outside of office hours.
- RV Storage Area Maintenance:
 - See Sylvia in the Arcadia Village office before you leave to confirm your RV spot registration and make sure she has updated phone number to reach you if needed
 - Make sure the RV spot/area is clearly marked if leaving it empty over the summer
 - Any items in the RV spot over the summer must be tagged with a current AVCC Registration Tag
 - Any items in the RV spot must have a State License Plate with current registration tags
 - Any RV Lot not clearly marked, confirmed with the office or registered may be reassigned
 - Any RV spot not kept/maintained will get one courtesy phone call and then we will clean up the lot and charge accordingly
 - RV spots are not spare car/truck storage. It is for Recreational Vehicle storage. The only vehicles allowed in an RV spot are the car/ truck towing the recreational vehicle.
 - If you're removing all items from RV area and will not be using it again, notify the office. Only the office can re-assign an RV Lot, Residents will not Sell, Transfer, Trade an RV Lot

ANNUAL CHINESE AUCTION MARCH 7, 2020 at 7:00 P.M.

ARE YOU READY? Well we are! We as a committee Janette Brockway Chairman, Wendy Carter, Mary Ann Gilmore, Brenda Dickey and Candy Meyers have already had meetings and been out getting donations and getting ready for this BIG event. I think everyone loves this event as much as all the committee members do.

We first want to THANK all of the residents of Arcadia Village who have donated to this event, THANK YOU.

Because of the popularity of this annual event we MUST restrict it to residents and registered guests only. NO non-residents or friends from outside the Arcadia Village will be allowed, they will not be allowed to come into the Cantina Clubhouse and browse either. The committee and donators put a tremendous amount of time and money into this endeavor to make it a success, so we all hope everyone will abide by the requirements that the committee has put in place.

We are looking for all kinds of donations, so if you have something to donate think of us first before Goodwill or Habitat. Think of us when you are done with your carport sale in February. If you are eating out or visiting an establishment that you think someone from the Arcadia Village would enjoy visiting, please ask for a donation that we would be able to offer to all of the residents. Brenda Dickey and Candy Myers are the ladies taking care of all of the donations this year. Where else can you get a dinner or gift certificate for 20 cents?

ALL DONATIONS THAT ARE NOT AUCTIONED OFF WILL BE PICKED UP BY HABITAT when the Chinese Auction is over. This will save you from taking your items to Habitat or Goodwill.

We will be setting up tables on Friday, March 6, 2020 at 10:00 a.m. if you are able to help it will be greatly appreciated.

HOW IT WORKS-for those of you who are not familiar with the procedures, this is a brief explanation of how the auction works. Each item will be placed on its designated table with a solo cup placed in front of it. There will be matching numbers on the cup and item. After you have viewed all of the items and decide which ones you would like to bid on, you can purchase tickets at 5 for \$1.00. Write your LOT # on the back of the ticket and place it in the cup of the item you wish to bid on. Of course, the more tickets you put in the cup, the better chance you have of winning that item.

HINT: bring address labels with just your lot # on them to stick on the tickets instead of having to write your lot # on each.

TICKET SALES-ticket sales will start as soon as we have completed getting all items on the tables with the red cup in front and the same number on both items. This is usually around 11:00 a.m. This year Wendy Carter will be in charge of ticket sales, she will put sign up sheets on the bulletin boards for anyone who would like to sell tickets for an hour or longer. Ticket sales will go all day long, so you can come and browse all day long to see all of the great items that are donated. Sales will stop at 6:00 p.m. and last tickets will have to be put in cups by 6:15 so volunteers can finish getting things ready. When auction begins and you have put tickets in the solo cups they are dumped in a bowl and ONE is picked out and if your house # is on it you win that item.

SEATS-EVERYONE HAS TO HAVE A SEAT TO COME AND JOIN THE AUCTION IN THE EVENING of March 7, 2020.

Cathy Murtaugh is in charge of selling the seats. THESE GO REALLY FAST and we will have as many seats set up as possible. The last few years we have sold out and added more chairs so make sure you get there to get yours, remember if you do not have a seat you will not be able to come to the auction in the evening. Seats will be sold for only \$1.00 per person and will be sold on FRIDAY, MARCH 6, 2020, FROM 1-2 P.M. in the Cantina Clubhouse.

Make sure you get to the clubhouse to get the seat you want, because they do go quickly. IF YOU ARE PURCHAS-ING A TABLE FOR 8 (this is all that is allowed at a table and all you can purchase at one time), please list all names and lot numbers on an envelope with money inside so the line will go faster. If you wish to purchase another table or more seats, you will have to get back in line and go thru the process all over again. First arrivals get first choice of seats, so make sure you get your seats ASAP on the day they go on sale. NO EARLY SALES, AND ALL WORKERS, RUNNERS AND VOLUNTEERS MUST HAVE A SEAT. Do not come and say you are only going to be a runner. You must have a seat.

After you purchase your seat, on the evening of the auction there will be a paddle put on your table with your house number on it. As the night goes along and you win one of the items being auctioned off, you will have to raise your paddle with your house number on it so the runners can find you to make your delivery. All items will be delivered to your table, so you do not have to get up. If you do not raise your paddle so the runners or the auctioneer can see it your item will be auctioned off again or will be put in the things that will be going to the Habitat Store. SO, make sure you pay attention or have your table help keep track for you.

RUNNERS-this becomes a tiring part of the auction. If you plan to run, please do so in short periods of time as this is very hard on your legs and body. There will be a sign-up sheet at the clubhouse on the bulletin boards. Mary Ann Gilmore is in charge of the runners and there will be a meeting at 6:30 p.m. sharp in the kitchen area, so if you sign up please be there on time so we can get started on time. This is a long night for some.

WE WILL NOT DELIVER ANY ITEMS TO YOUR HOME-so please don't ask. Make sure you have a way to haul them away as soon as the auction is over.

If you are not going to be at the auction and have seen something that you cannot do without and that you have put tickets in and won, have your neighbor or friend pick them up for you, if they are not picked up they will go in the truck for Habitat.

HEALTH DEPT CONTACTS AV

The Florida Health Department has contacted Arcadia Village about the growing concern of the Hepatitis A virus that has developed in Arcadia. Over the last 10 years that has been one case of Hepatitis A in Arcadia. The concern became very apparent after 5 cases were detected in 2019. Hepatitis A can cause liver failure and death, although this is rare, and occurs more commonly in people 50 years of age or older, and people with liver diseases, such as hepatitis B and C.

As gross as it may sound, the Hepatitis A virus is found in the poop of the people who have the virus. If a person with the virus doesn't wash his or her hands after going to the bathroom, it can transfer to people, objects, food and drinks.

SOME PEOPLE WHO SHOULD NOT GET THIS VACCINE

- If you have ever had a life-threating allergic reaction from a Hepatitis A vaccine or a severe allergy from any part of this vaccine, you may be advised not to get vaccinated.
- 2) If you are not feeling well. If you only have a mild illness such as a cold, you can probably get the vaccine. The health care provider from the health department will ask you all the questions that they feel are necessary to provide you with a safe vaccination.

COST: Free to Medicare, Medicaid and Uninsured. Canadians who do not have insurance in the US may receive this vaccine. They will only be asked if they have insurance. The Answer is NO. They do not need to know you are from Canada.

The Florida Health Department will be holding a Hepatitis A vaccine administration on March 19th from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm at the Cantina Clubhouse.

There will be a form that will need to be completed when getting the vaccine. To save some time, there will be someone at the Cantina on the following dates.

Friday, March 13th. 1-2 pm and Tuesday, March 17th 9-11 am.






