As residents return to Arcadia Village, we urge you to read notices at amenities, clubhouses, and bulletin boards and in the newsletter to stay up to date on what is happening.

COVID-19, Delta & Variants and the Flu are mostly spread by respiratory droplets released when people cough, sneeze, or talk. Someone can also get sick by touching a surface or object that has the virus on it and then touching their own nose, mouth, or possibly their eyes. COVID-19 may be spread by people who are not showing symptoms. Therefore, personal prevention practices (such as frequent hand washing, social distancing and staying home when sick) and environmental cleaning and disinfection, as well as use of masks are important principles. RULES AND REGULATIONS:

During off season, I am tasked with inspections which means driving around to find any homes that the weeds are over grown either around the house or in planters, and look at houses that need to be power washed or possibly painted. I then call home owner to make them aware. Remember it's your responsibility to have a designated person or company that will maintain your home while you are away from Arcadia Village for any length of time. I do put reminders in the newsletter for you toward the end and beginning of season

We do this to help keep up the value of your homes in the village and to keep the village beautiful for all residents and visitors alike.

OTHER OFFICE MATTERS: Please call to make an appointment. All visits to the office request a mask and that you stand back the 6' from the desk as shown on the floor markings.

TRASH – Reminder from the Desoto Landfill Waste Department: All Trash must be bagged, including trash in a container with a lid **must be bagged**. Please do not fill a bag so full the trash collectors cannot lift it. We do not want to get anyone injured.

Bulk Waste is any material that does not fit into your trash can or a tied garbage bag. Flammable substances, hazardous waste, medical waste, construction or demolition debris, tires, furniture, (not a complete list) cannot be put out for trash pickup. You, or your contractor's are responsible for getting these items to the landfill. Moving or other boxes should be broken down and tied together. You can find the Holiday Trash pickup Schedule at the Post Office Bulletin Board and the back of the Monthly Newsletter.

WATER TURN ON/OFF – Requests to TURN-ON/OFF water need be during business hours, Monday through Friday (9:00AM thru 3:00PM) (No Weekend water turn on/off, **and** you must have an authorized representative (or be there yourself) at the house at the time water is turned on, when requesting off, make sure you have shut down water sources including the Water Heater.

RENT LETTERS went out the end of September. If you need an additional copy, please contact the office.

GATE UPGRADE:

The **new** Front Gate Phone Number that will call out has **changed:** 863-266-8542.

Back Gate phone number is: 863-263-4314. This is the number that will call your designated telephone when a person coming into the park when the gate is down dials your House Number.

(We recommend you put these numbers into your telephone directory so you do not ignore the call)

SLOW-DOWN STOP LOOK

We have a posted 15-mph Speed Limit in-side the park.

STOP at Stop Signs! they are put at street corners for a reason.

SEE SOMETHING – SAY SOMETHING!

Many times we receive a call about an incident or concern from a resident that saw something or was concerned about something they witnessed or heard about and they wait until the next day or a couple days later to let the office or security know. We cannot investigate or take care of if we do not have all the facts, What/Where/When/Who and we need it when it happens. We need details if you want us to do something. Please try to take a note or use your phone note pad to make notes as needed.

Please contact Security (863-558-1656) after hours or the Office during hours when you see something. The sooner we know or see it the better we can take care of it.

Bag tags need to be placed on your golf bag by Jan 1, 2022 and visible to rangers, we have had several changes within the commission. RECIPES FOR NOVEMBER

HOME MADE PUMPKIN PIE SPICE

There is nothing better than the smell of pumpkin spice in November I love to make a batch of this spice mix to have on hand throughout the fall season and sprinkle a little when I make muffins, pie, pancakes, cookies, just about anything you want that awesome homemade pumpkin taste.

INGREDIENTS:

4 tsp fresh ground cinnamon 1 tsp ground cloves
2 tsp ground ginger 1/2 tsp fresh ground nutmeg

Mix all ingredients. Store in an airtight container in a cool, dry place up to 6 months



APPLE CIDER, CRANBERRY, AND GINGER PUNCH

A festive choice for a happy hour, this fall cocktail is made with ginger beer, fresh cranberries and apple cider, Add a few ounces of gin for an adults only beverage, or leave it out to enjoy with family.

INGREDIENTS

1/3 cup fresh cranberries 2 tablespoons sugar
1 1/2 cups fresh apple cider 2/3 cup chilled ginger beer
2 tablespoons fresh lemon juice 3 1/2 ounces (1/4 cup plus 3 tablespoons) gin, if desired

Muddle cranberries with sugar in a pitcher. Add apple cider, ginger beer, lemon juice, and gin if desired. Divide among 4 glasses. Serve chilled or over ice.

VEGAN GINGERBREAD CINNAMON ROLLS

Prep Time 15 min — Cook Time 1 hour 30 min — Servings 12 Rolls

INGREDIENTS ROLLS:

1 tablespoon ground flax seed + 3 tbsp water
3/4 cup unsweetened plain soy milk or other unsweetened plain non-dairy milk
1/4 cup vegan butter (I used Earth Balance) 2 1/2 cups unbleached all-purpose flour
1 packet active dry yeast 1/4 cup sugar
1/2 teaspoon salt 1/4 cup room temperature water

FILLING:

1/3 cup brown sugar 2 tsp cinnamon
1 tsp ground ginger 1/2 tsp fresh ground nutmeg
1/4 tsp ground cloves 1/3 cup vegan butter
1/2 tsp black pepper (optional spicy kick) 1/4 tsp cayenne pepper (optional spicy kick)

GINGERBREAD FROSTING:

1 1/2 cups powder sugar 1/2 tsp ground cinnamon
1/4 tsp ground ginger 3 tbs unsweetened plain non-dairy milk

RECIPES FOR NOVEMBER

VEGAN GINGERBREAD CINNAMON ROLLS continued

INSTRUCTIONS:

Mix the ground flax seed and water in a small mixing bowl and set aside to thicken and become a flax "egg" .

Combine the soy milk and vegan butter in a microwave safe container and microwave for 30 seconds. Stir, and microwave another 20-30 seconds. Alternatively, you could warm the soy milk and vegan butter on the stove. Do not boil. Liquid should not exceed 140°. Ideal temperature is 110-120°. If it is too hot it will kill the yeast.

Mix the flour, active dry yeast, sugar, and salt together in a large mixing bowl .

Pour the soy milk and butter mixture into the bowl (remember, it should be between 110-120° F). Also add the water and flax egg and use a whisk to stir. Once it's too sticky to whisk, use your hands to combine the ingredients. Transfer the dough onto a floured workspace, and knead it until you've got a smooth dough ball. Place the dough ball into a lightly greased mixing bowl, and cover with plastic wrap or a kitchen towel, and allow it to rise for about one hour... While the dough is rising move onto making the filling...

FILLING

Make the filling for the rolls by combining the brown sugar, cinnamon, ginger, nutmeg, black pepper, cayenne pepper, and cloves in a small mixing bowl Melt 1/3 cup of vegan butter.

ASSEMBLE ROLLS:

Preheat Oven to 375° Once the dough has doubled in size, you can press out the air, then transfer it back onto your floured work space. Roll the dough until it is about 1/6th inch thick, and about 12x16 inches. Brush the dough with the melted butter, and top with sugar spice mix. Roll the dough tightly. Carefully cut the roll into 1 inch slices, you'll have about a dozen. Or cut them a little thicker to make 8 larger rolls. Place the rolls onto a greased skillet or baking dish (about 10x10). Bake for 30 minutes, until they're slightly golden on the top.

MADE GINGERBREAD FROSTING

Place powdered sugar in a mixing bowl, and stir in the cinnamon and ginger powder. Add the non-dairy milk, and whisk until creamy. Add more non-dairy milk if you want it thinner.

Remove rolls from oven, and allow to cool for 5-10 minutes. Top with Gingerbread Frosting, and serve immediately

MONTHLY ARTICLE NOVEMBER 2021

SUBJECT: HOUSEHOLD SAFETY AND SECURITY

The following are items of importance that we as a community should be doing to keep us all safe and sound:

1. **MAKE SURE YOU HAVE:** Fire, Sherriff, and Ambulance either posted near your phone, or if you are using cell phone only, put them in your contact list. In case of Emergency - Dial 911

Desoto Fire - 863-993-4843

Desoto Sherriff - 863-993-4700

Ambulance - 863-993-4842

2. **INSIDE THE HOME:** Make sure your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors are up-to-date, they are only good for 8 to 10 years, and they will still look like they are good but they may not work properly. If you take them off they will have a manufacture date and an expiration date. Replace them if they exceed the expiration date or if you do not know how old they are, I put the month and year on the outside when I replace them, so it is easy to see at a glance. Also, replace the batteries twice a year, best time is when we change the clocks (Fall and Spring), this includes the hardwired smoke detectors, as they have a battery back-up usually. If any resident needs help installing a smoke detector or changing batteries in a detector or have their home extinguisher tested call Gary Larson @ Lot 415, he plus another resident here will be more than happy to go see what is needed. If you have a question call Joe Enderby or Joe Wentworth (numbers below). Also, if you have a fire extinguisher, make sure it is still good, if a powder extinguisher, take and shake it upside down to loosen the powder every month of so, also make sure if it has an indicator that it is still in the green. Fire Extinguishers last between 5 and 15 years, so if you don't know how old it is, best to replace it. (Remember: If you have a fire in your house - "**GET OUT**" belongings and everything else can be replaced, you can't be replaced.)

3. **OUTSIDE THE HOME:** Make sure your home has a lot number that is visible from the street, no bushes/shrubs blocking the view. It is also advisable to have it illuminated, so that emergency responders, delivery truck drivers at night can easily see it. Everyone should make sure their outside light on either the planter or home is working at night to help with lighting up the neighborhood, for both security reasons and neighbors walking at night. If you have no markings on your house contact Sylvia Clay at the office to have a plaque put on your house with your name and Lot #.

4. **NIGHTLY CHECK:** Before you go to bed, walk around the house, if you burn candles - make sure they are all out, then check the stove/oven to make sure it is off. Then go out and make sure your shed, vehicle and golf cart are secured (**LOCKED/KEY REMOVED**), as these are the easy targets of thieves. Lastly lock all your doors. If you have a deadbolt - set it to "**LOCKED**". If you do this as a routine, it becomes second nature, and will keep you and yours safe and secure.

5. **YOUR NEIGHBORS:** Remember none of us are getting younger, we must look out for each other. If you have a neighbor that lives alone, check in with them every day to make sure they are fine. We are all neighbors and family in this community. We have to look out for each other. It would be a shame if someone falls and is not found for days, this could be tragic for not only that individual, but for the person that could have prevented it from being a tragic event. We are one big family here in the Village!
