INFORMATIONAL:

Feeding wildlife is not allowed. The Florida Sand Hill Crane is protected by the U.S. Migratory Bird Treaty Act and as a State-designated Threatened species by [Florida's Endangered and Threatened Species Rule](#).

And under **Florida Law**, "it is illegal to **feed** manatees, **sand hill cranes**, bears, raccoons, foxes, and **alligators**." and not advisable to feed other wildlife.

Additionally, Rule #25 of the Arcadia Village Rules and Regulations states in part: "Any feeding, housing, harboring or other solicitation of stray animals by residents is strictly prohibited."

Additionally common sense tells us that feeding wildlife can cause damage to you, your home and others nearby. Wildlife that expects food on a regular basis from an outside source will continue to come for that source of food, if you are away for any length of time or move away the wildlife will continue to come and can cause damage to homes, people, domestic animals. Please recognize that it is best to enjoy and appreciate watching wildlife but to leave them alone.



back Clean up after your pet. Even in out of the way areas, around ponds, maintenance area, burn lot. Respect your park and clean up after your pet.

Speed Limit is 15MPH in the whole park. Please follow the speed limit. The alternative solutions will not be liked by the continuous offenders.

Residents are responsible to have a "Do Not Mow" sign in their yard if they do not want their yard to be mowed.

During employee holidays, vacations, sick days, etc., there could be a different employee mowing an area.

They are not responsible for mowing a yard without a sign.

Traveling Residents and/or Residents that maintain multiple homes, do not forget that you are responsible for the maintenance of the outside of your home, weeds, plants, trees, etc., all year long. Also remember to put away small items outside your home. Thank you in advance for your cooperation

If you currently occupy a storage space it must be kept trimmed and neat as well **all 12 months of the year**.

Rental Negotiations 2022

If you have a desire to learn more about rental negotiations, join our team.

In 2021 we negotiated for one year only due to the high inflation rate. Since the team made that decision, we will have to negotiate again this year. Hopefully the inflation rate will drop and we can settle a three-year rental lot agreement.

The owners compare our community with a number of other counties and 55 plus communities to determine the rate increase. We need residents, preferable fulltime, to help the committee. The negotiations take place during the summer so it is important to be here to work on this.

There are three main forms of lease agreements within the community.

- ◆ The legacy lifetime lease that was signed prior to the current owners. These agreements are a set rate and not negotiable.
- ◆ The CPI (Consumer Price Index) lease are only available to residents that purchase a new home. These leases are not negotiable either.
- ◆ This leaves the third lease agreement which is the majority of the homeowners.

The HOA represents the third group of homeowners in case management decides to sell, and also negotiate rent increases. Florida statute 723 requires the HOA to obtain consent from the majority of the affected homeowners in writing. Florida statute 723 gives the HOA a seat at the negotiation table.

The HOA does need to approve the rent agreement this is true, however we have very little say in the actual rent increase. The reason the HOA does meet with the owners is to ensure the rent increase is reasonable and to make sure there are no reduction in services or utilities

ARCADIA VILLAGE SECURITY AND NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH MONTHLY ARTICLE FEBRUARY 2022

Topic: **Arcadia Village Speed Limit and Driving in the Village**

Arcadia Village Speed Limit:

The speed limit in the village is **(15 MPH)** from the front gate to the back gate, no exceptions. All residents, guests and delivery drivers **(MUST)** abide by this rule. Speeds over this are dangerous to both residents and animals that live in the village. This goes for all vehicles, (trucks, cars, SUV's, golf carts, and bicycles). There are a few golf carts that have the chips in them that allows them to reach speeds of up to 30 MPH.

Just because the cart can go that fast, you are not allowed to exceed 15 MPH in the village. To drive a golf cart in the village you must be a licensed driver per Arcadia Village rules, no kids driving the golf carts.

All vehicles must abide by traffic laws, you must stop at all STOP signs, look both ways and proceed when clear, don't think because you are a golf cart or bicycle that you don't have to stop. When coming off the golf course, you must stop before entering the paved streets. At any intersection that does not have a stop sign (Intersection of Cantina and International) please stop and check for other vehicles. At all speed bumps, please allow golf carts and bicycles the right of way to go thru the center before you proceed to cross the speed bumps, (being courteous is always the best way to proceed) and golf carts cannot go over the speed bumps easily. In turn, if you are driving a golf cart or bicycle, be careful, cars and trucks are a lot bigger than you, wait and see if they stop before you proceed into the center. If you are riding a golf cart or bicycle at slower than 15 MPH, be courteous and pull to the right and stop and allow vehicles to pass you. **"Do Not"** use cell phones (talking or texting) when driving or bicycling in the village, it is dangerous and could lead to a needless loss of life or injury, it can wait until you get to where you are going!

When driving concentrate on driving and don't be distracted by cell phones, or passengers. Remember, this is a retirement community and no one should be in such a rush as to exceed the speed limit, and endanger our residents. Report all violations to either the Security Manager (Joe Enderby) or the Office Manager (Sylvia Clay).

Remember, this is our community. We have to look out for each other, as there is no one else to do it. Be safe, and courteous at all times.

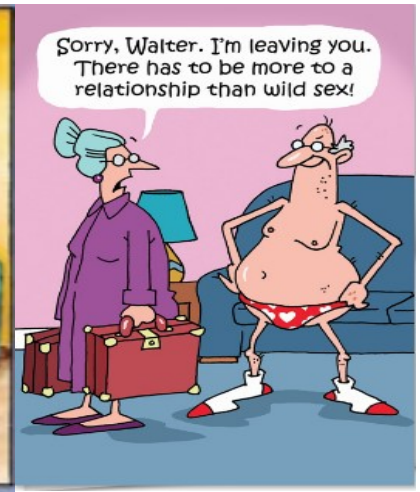
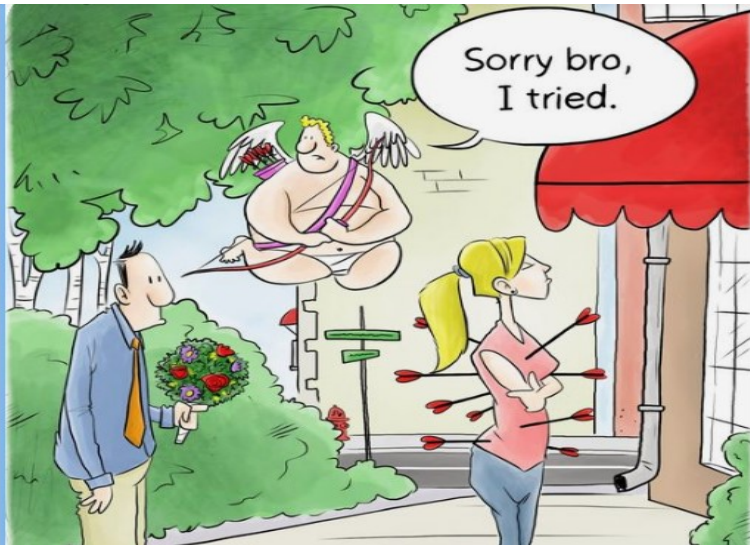
The Editor's choice for VOLUNTEER(S) OF THE MONTH

HERE IS 3 WAYS TO ENJOY**

**SMOKEY 2 BEAN CHILI
1 HOUR – 6 CUPS**

This bold-flavored chili is thickened with grated carrots, which also lend a hint of natural sweetness. Simmering the sauce ingredients and spices before adding the beans allows the flavors to develop without having to fry or sauté anything.

- 1 15oz can no salt-added diced tomatoes
- 2 Cups chopped onions
- 1 Cup chopped green pepper
- 1 Cup grated carrots
- 3 Cloves garlic, minced
- 2 Tbs chili powder
- 2 Tsp ancho chili powder
- 1 15oz Can kidney beans rinse/drain
- 1 15oz Can black beans rinse/drain

In a large saucepan or Dutch oven combine the first seven ingredients (not the beans yet)

And 3 cups water. Cover and bring to boiling over medium heat, reduce heat. Simmer, covered, 30 min.

Stir in Kidney beans and Black beans. Cover and simmer about 20 minutes more or until chili is thickens

EASY CHILI FRIES

Cut 1 Lg Russet or Sweet potato lengthwise into wedges. Soak wedges in water for about 10 minutes, drain and pat dry.

Preheat oven 400° and bake 20-30 min until brown and crispy or Air-fry potato wedges 10-15 minutes or until browned.

Serve topped with chili, 2 tbs chopped scallion, 2 tsp chopped cilantro and/or smashed avocado.

CHILI TACOS

Fill each of two 6 inch whole wheat or corn tortillas with 1/3 cup hot chili, 3 Tbs diced tomatoes, 2 slices avocado, and Tbs thinly sliced lettuce or cabbage. Serve with Salsa & hot sauce

ZESTY CHILI BOWL WITH CUCUMBER MINT RELISH

For Relish, in a blender combine 1 ½ cups chopped peeled Cucumber; 1 cup fresh Mint Leaves; 4 scallions, chopped; and 1 tsp. Lemon or lime juice, Cover and blend until chunky. Fill each of two large bowls with ½ cup hot cooked brown rice or other whole grain of choice, ½ cup steamed cauliflower, and ½ cup hot chili. Top with relish, makes 2 bowls

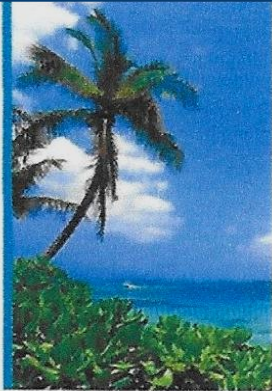

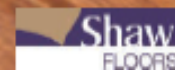

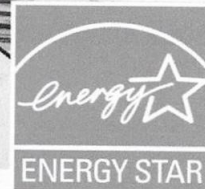
