### **SEASONAL REMINDERS:**

### Help us Keep the Park Beautiful by following the Rules:

- Upgrade Guidelines: We have a lot of new residents this year and I would like to remind you to take some time to review the Rules and Regulations you received at time of purchasing your home. If you are thinking about some improvements ie: pavers or patio I have a list of guidelines in the office. Do not hesitate to contact the office for any questions.
- PARKING: is in your driveway or as needed spare parking for limited time is in the Club House Parking lots. Do Not Park your extra cars in the RV Lot, in the Spare or Empty Lots or the Streets. Additionally this time of year the office parking lot (532) is often full with residents, sales and employees, please do not park your extra vehicle in the office parking lot especially November through March. Temporary Parking Permit for clubhouse parking can be requested at the office.
- Please Pick-up after your pet. Everywhere! IMPORTANT: Do not put your doggie poop bags in the dumpsters or trash cans. They need to go into a trash can with a bag in it. Trash pickup people do not pickup individual dog poop bags out of the dumpsters or garbage cans.
- When the Gates are down, Use your clicker or call the house number to be let in. DO NOT PUSH or PULL THE GATE! Gates are Video Monitored and repairs will be charged to your lot. If you have problems Call 999.
- Bikers please get off your bike and walk around the gate.
- Cantina / Siesta Kitchen Rules Responsible to clean up after yourself in kitchen. When a resident or group in the village use either club house for an event with or without food, you and you're group are responsible for cleaning up after your event putting back furniture where it was originally and taking out the trash bags from the event, please do not leave food event trash in the clubhouse over night or a weekend to leak or smell up the building. The village cleaning person does daily cleaning maintenance and replenishment of supplies. She is not responsible for setup, cleanup Putting away of event furniture or trash. She leaves in every trash can extra bags in the cans under the current use bag. So if you take out the trash there is always a new bag to replenish the can. Contact Sylvia in the office if you have any questions. Thank you.

Thanks for everyone who came out for our Annual meeting for the golf commission. It was well attended and we had good discussions.

One question that came up was how do you get on the golf commission. Answer, the golf commission accepts nominations and then votes on it when there is a vacancy. We will be

having a vacancy this year and if you have someone you would like to nominate, Please see any commissioner with your suggestion. Please do this by March 30th so we can vote on it at our final meeting before this season ends in early April. We prefer people who are here full time as the work continues all year. Must be physically fit and capable of cutting holes filling sand boxes etc.

- Bag tags (White Only) need to be placed on your golf bag and visible to rangers
- Please keep in mind that you are required to use a tee off the tee boxes and use the sand mix to fill any divots.
   Sand boxes are located close by so please fill that area. White lines have also been painted in front of the greens to keep carts away from greens.
- We are seeing too many handicappers just driving straight down the fairways. You must still apply a <u>90 Deg rule</u> to the fairways.

As you can see on hole 14, Construction is underway to lengthen this hole and make it a dogleg par 4 for next season. Please be patient and careful as workers may be out there.

### ARCADIA VILLAGE SECURITY AND NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH ARTICLE FOR MARCH 2022

Topic: Arcadia Village Speed Limit and Use of Hand signals on bicycles and golf carts MARCH 13<sup>th</sup> IS TIME TO SPRING AHEAD 1 HOUR AND CHECK YOUR SMOKE DETECTORS

> VILLAGE SPEED LIMIT

### **Arcadia Village Speed Limit:**

Again, remember the speed limit in the Village is **15MPH**, there is no need to go any faster. We are getting reports of people exceeding the limit, and if it continues formal reports will be made against individuals who have been reported.

If you are riding a bicycle or operating a golf cart without signals, then please be aware of the proper hand signals to use below: 5.26. Turn Signals and Emergency Signals

You must use hand signals or directional signals to show that you are about to turn. Turn signals are reguired when changing lanes or overtaking a vehicle. It is against the law to use your directional signals to tell drivers behind you that they can pass. Four-way emergency flashers should only be used while your vehicle is legally stopped or disabled on the highway or shoulder.







ALL SIGNALS ARE MADE WITH THE LEFT ARM ONLY, NEVER USE YOUR RIGHT ARM! PASSENGERS ON GOLF CARTS ARE NOT TO GIVE SIGNALS!

The bus holds 8 donors at a time and will be on the tennis court side of Cantina Clubhouse for collecting whole blood or if you prefer double red blood cells. If you gave double red cells in January you will not be able to give again in March. Your blood is used by a local hospital to save lives. You never know when you or a loved one will need this precious gift. Blood supply is critically low


### **AM/CAN THANK YOU**

### March is ... National Nutrition Month from Sylvia Clay

Healthy Corner

THIS YEAR'S THEME IS "CELEBRATE A WORLD OF FLAVORS"

I thought about a corn beef and potatoes recipe for St. Patrick's Day and I am guessing you already have your own favorite recipe or have a favorite restaurant you go to, to enjoy that dish with green beer, so for this month I thought I would give you another one of my favorite world dishes, Indian Masala. I like that Indian food is packed with flavor and very aromatic and healthy. HINT Did you know when you try out a new recipe and if there is a spice that you do not have, never heard of and are not at all sure you want to spend 2 dollars to 5 dollars for a jar of a spice you may never use again there is great way to get it for pennies. I have done this a couple of times in my experimental cooking, I go to the bulk store Earth Origins over in Port Charlotte in the Lowe's shopping plaza, they have a bulk grain and spice section. You can put in a teaspoon or tablespoon or more of any spice you want into a baggie and it costs you pennies instead of dollars to try it out. I did that with a spice called Garam Masala and also Cardamom pods. I have found that I like cooking with these two new spices and several others and they have become a regular staple in my spice cabinet.

This month we have two recipes for you to try. One was a submission from a resident "One Pot Pasta Dish" The other is a simple Indian Chana Masala dish that is easy to make, served with Naan bread or over brown rice completes the experience. This recipe has a few of those hard to find spices but worth the trouble if you love flavor. (hint) I love to add cauliflower to this dish at the end. It just adds that extra flavor that I love in my Masala dish.

### CHANA MASALA

1 cup white chickpeas raw, 200 grams, soaked overnight or use 2.5 cups canned chickpeas

1/8 tsp salt as needed.

1 inch ginger

3-4 large garlic cloves

1 green chili (optional) but adds flavor

2 Tbs Olive or Avocado Oil

1 bay Leaf

4 whole green cardamoms

3 cloves

1 inch cinnamon stick

7-8 whole black peppercorns

3/4 tsp cumin seeds

1 large red onion finely chopped

2 tomatoes pureed

1 Tbs tomato paste

1 tsp coriander powder

½ tsp cumin powder

½ tsp paprika

1/4 tsp turmeric powder

1/4 to 1/2 tsp garam masala

1 tsp dried fenugreek leaves

1-2 Tbs chopped cilantro or Parsley

Using a mortar and pestle, crush the ginger, garlic and green chili. Set it aside.

Heat a pot/pan over medium heat on stove-top. Once hot, add the oil and then add the whole spices- bay leaf, green cardamom, cloves, cinnamon, peppercorns and cumin seeds.

Let the spices sizzle for 30 seconds and become fragrant.

Add the finely chopped onion and stir. Cook for 3 minutes until the onions soften. Add 1/4 teaspoon salt here so that onions cook a little faster. Meanwhile puree 2 tomatoes using a blender and set aside. Add the crushed ginger-garlic and green chili. Stir and cook for a minute or two until the raw smell of the ginger-garlic goes away.

Add the pureed tomatoes along with 1 tablespoon of tomato paste. Stir and cook for 5 minutes on medium heat, stirring often.



Then add the ground spices- coriander powder, cumin powder, paprika, turmeric and garam masala. Cook the spices for 30 seconds. The oil should ooze out of the sides of the masala at this point.

Stir in the chickpeas and mix. Also add 2 cups of water and stir. If you soaked and cooked your chickpeas from scratch you can use the chickpea water were boiled. You can add more water here if you prefer more gravy in your chana masala.

Taste test and adjust the spice as needed. Cover the pot with a lid, set heat to medium-low and let it simmer for 10-15 minutes for the flavors to mix-in together. (add cauliflower at this point)


Stir in crushed fenugreek and chopped cilantro.

Garnish with more cilantro or parsley and serve Chana Masala with rice or naan! You may also squeeze some fresh lemon juice if desired.

Substitute for Kasoori methi (Fenugreek leaves)

### If you don't have kasoori methi you can substitute:

- 1 teaspoon dried methi for each tablespoon fresh needed.
- 1 tablespoon fresh, chopped fresh celery leaves per teaspoon dried methi needed.
- OR 1 tablespoon fresh Chinese celery leaves per teaspoon dried.
- OR 1 tablespoon fresh watercress leaves


