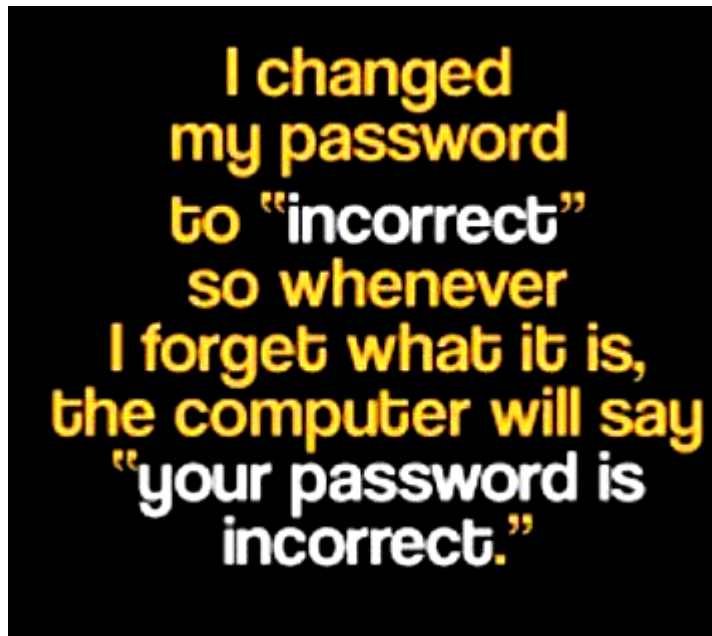
Nice to keep making strides toward a return to “normal”.....

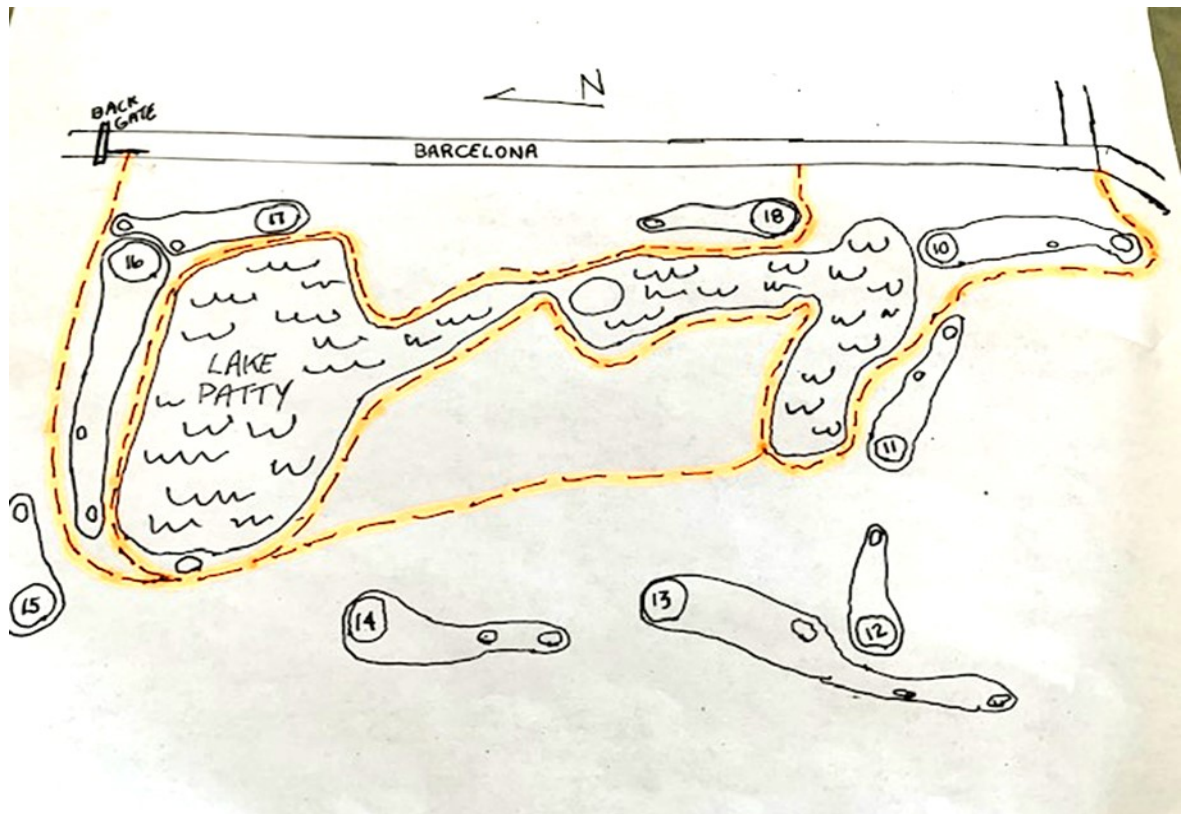

APRIL 2022**

**Topic: PREPARING YOUR UNIT FOR DEPARTURE FOR THE SUMMER
REVIEW OF SOME OF THE SAFETY ITEMS WHILE WALKING IN THE VILLAGE**

Preparing your home for leaving for the summer:

Here is a list of things you may want to do if you are leaving your home for an extended period of time:

1. Install hurricane shutters.
2. Put saran wrap over the toilet bowl. Flush first. Keeps water in bowl, as this prevents water drying up and allowing sewer gases and critters to come in.
3. Turn your Hot water heater off.
4. Turn the Whole house water shutoff to off.
5. Open cabinet doors ajar and closet doors, including dishwasher to allow air to circulate.
6. Consider putting in containers of damp rid around inside the house and shed.
7. Set thermostat for AC to 80 and the humidistat at 65. (Prevent mold from starting while your gone)
- 8 You can leave the refrigerator turned on, but you can also empty and turn off. If you turn off, leave doors ajar.
9. Put all porch and lawn things away. Any loose items that the wind can grab and fly around causing damage.
10. Put golf cart inside the shed to protect it or secure it in case of high winds.
11. Notify the office of when you will be leaving and returning, and make sure they have a phone number for you in case of any issues.

2. Safety while walking/running in the village:

Here are some reminders:

Walk/run on the left side of the road facing traffic.

Wear clothing that is highly visible, a high visibility reflective vest is best.

Don't wear dark clothing.

If you are going to listen to music, make sure (1) ear is open to hear what is happening around you.

Look both ways before crossing any road.

At night have a working flashlight with you so you will be seen.

Have a great summer, and we will see you in the fall.
