RENTERS: Renters should have checked in with the Village office. If you have not, please do, we have a renter's handout for you and it helps us keep the village safe and informed.

<u>WATER ON/OFF</u> – Requests to TURN-ON/OFF water should be called into the office and will be done during business hours, Mon - Fri (8:00AM thru 3:00PM). Resident is responsible to have an authorized representative (or be on site yourself) at the time water is turned on. When you call to request water turn off, make sure you have shut down water sources including your Water Heater.

SEASONAL REMINDERS:

To Schedule an event at the 19th Hole Picnic area - See Calendar in the Office.

Please Clean-up after your pet. It's for your pet's safety and yours.

No Sprinklers allowed, contact the office if you are putting down Sod.

No Parking in empty lots, Please use the clubhouse for extra vehicle parking more than 4-hours.

Speed Limit is (15-MPH) Help us keep everyone safe.

Please remember to update the office if you have changed your northern address or phone numbers.

Contact the office if you need your phone programmed into the gate.

Remember to take the trash out to the Dumpster at the end of your event, this prevents bugs and bad smells from gathering in the clubhouse. See Event/Party Guidelines posted in the Kitchens.

OFFICE NEWS CONTINUED:



PLEASE...Speed Limit in the Arcadia Village Park is (15-MPH) no exceptions! Resident bikers & bikers with friends are allowed to ride through park at the Park Speed Limit (15-MPH). If bikers use the back gate or front gate after hours, bring your clicker, Do Not Push/Pull or Lift or break the gate.

- Did you know that both Gates have cameras? Please do not Push Pull or otherwise try to open gates without a clicker. Call the house number of the resident for access.
- RV Parking in front of your house is a MAXIMUM of 2 Days only to Load or Un-Load. NO Car,
 Trailer or RV parking in empty lots, we cannot mow or otherwise maintain the property properly
 – and you risk doing major damage to underground utilities, especially when the ground is
 saturated. Street Parking is 4 hour parking limit, if you need longer, you should park at a Club
 House with your parking permit on your dash for identification.
- Please make sure you have scheduled your power wash and gutter cleaning and weeding.
 Home inspections will resume once hurricane recovery (x2) is under control.
- Please take a look at your RV Lot and clean up as needed.
- A few resident lot number signs have blown away. Please replace your identification at your earliest convenience. Thank you.
- Club House Events: Residents and Event coordinators that have a events, dance, dinner, food, etc...., are to make sure all trash is bagged, tied and removed to the dumpster <u>outside</u> the clubhouse. (you will find dumpster outside kitchen door next to Gym) Events are also responsible for wiping down tables, floors, kitchens as used and if you move furniture around during an event you are to move it back to the way it was before your event.

STUFFED PEPPERS YOUR WAY

A comfort dish for those January chilly days and when a lot of us try to start a new healthy way of eating and exercising. By adjusting ingredients you can make them any flavor you are in the mood for, see below examples for Mexican and Italian. I am removing the meat and oil, replacing with vegetable broth and beans or grains for that healthy kick. If you use Cheese, use sparingly to enhance flavor and not take away from the other flavors of the dish.

Yields about 4-8 servings – Make once and eat 2 or 3 times, just freeze the leftovers, or freeze half the batch for next month.

INGREDIENTS

4-6 Red, Yellow, Green Peppers Vegetable Broth

1 Cup cooked brown rice (sub: quinoa) 1 Tbs chopped garlic or 1tsp garlic pwd

1 Cup Mushrooms chopped 1/2 Cup Carrots chopped small

1 Med onion chopped 12 tsp dried thyme

favorite mrs dash to taste

add as you want; chopped zucchini, squash or your favorite vegetable, make it your own.

INSTRUCTIONS

Preheat oven to 375° F,

Make the Rice or quinoa according to package instructions, while that is cooling chop your vegetables garlic. In medium to large fry pan, add 2-3 the vegetable broth and saute onion and garlic until soft, add carrots, and any other hard vegetable that you wanted to add. Sauté until starts to soften. Remove pan from heat. Stir in remaining ingredients and rice or quinoa.

Wash and Slice peppers either in half lengthwise or remove tops and clean out centers.

Fill peppers with ingredients in pan. Put into a baking dish with a little bit of broth, cover with foil and bake 30-40 min. Serve with parmesan or feta cheese crumbles sprinkled over peppers and top with chopped parsley.

You design how you want to flavor them. Let your imagination of spices and ingredients be your guide. You can also stuff a zucchini by slicing lengthwise and scooping out the middle. Have fun.

Make them Mexican Flavored:

Add Chili powder, add can of black beans and 1 cup corn, increase garlic to 2 Tbs and add small 4oz can of Diced tomatoes with green chili's (mild or hot), add some chopped parsley or cilantro to the sauté. Bake 30 min. Sprinkle lightly with cheddar cheese and bake additional 10 min, serve with a sprinkle of cilantro or parsley and throw some avocado on the side when serving.

Make them Italian Flavored:

Exchange Rice with elbow macaroni and add can of garbanzo beans or red beans, add 15oz can of chopped tomatoes or 6 to 8 chopped plum tomatoes and cup of chopped spinach or kale to the sauté mixture toward the end. Modify spices to basil and oregano. Bake 30 min. Top with a small amount of mozzarella and bake additional 10 min. Server with sprinkle of parsley
