PARKING - Extra parking is in your driveway or spare parking is in the Club House Parking lots. **Do Not Park** your extra cars in the RV Lot or in the Spare or Empty Lots or the Streets. Temporary Parking passes for clubhouse parking can be requested at the office.

OFFICE NEWS CONTINUED:

PETS - Please Pick-up after your pet, everywhere! Do not put your doggie poop bags in the dumpsters or trash cans. They need to go into a trash can with a bag in it. ALL Pets must be leashed when outside of the home.

GATES - When the Gates are down, Use your clicker or DIAL the house number to be let in. Give contractors your house number to dial, then you can let them in the back gate as needed.

DO NOT PUSH or PULL THE GATE! Gates are Video Monitored and repairs will be charged to your lot. If you have problems Call 999 from Gate Key Pad. Bikers please get off your bike and walk around the gate.

CANTINA / SIESTA Kitchen Rules –When a resident group in the village use either club house for an event with or without food, you and you're group are responsible for cleaning up after your event, putting back furniture where it was originally, and taking out the trash bags from the event to the dumpster located at each clubhouse, please do not leave food event trash in the clubhouse over night or a weekend to leak or smell up the building. PLEASE READ FOR ALL OUR SAFETY

Hurricane Preparedness 2023 and beyond.....

As a result, from last year's event of Hurricane Ian, it is our attempt as the HOA Board to gather volunteers to help us better prepare for future events and to help recover from the unexpected. We held our first meeting, February 9th, to brainstorm and assemble our next steps as a committee. The initial concept is to assemble block captains to be responsible in making contact with at least 20 of your neighbors.

Next meeting **March 13th at 4 p.m. at Cantina**

Right now, as we continue to evolve, we know the responsibilities for block captains will be the following:

1. Be willing to make contact with at least 20 homeowners.
2. Each block captain will be assigned a number of homes based on the number of volunteers we have.
3. In addition, responsibility, 3 days prior to an event (such as a hurricane), the block captain shall verify and make contact with their assigned 20 or so neighbors to determine what their current status is and their current contact information.
 - A. If your neighbor is a seasonal resident, do they have someone watching their home?
 - B. If your neighbor is a full-time resident, determine what their plans in the way of IE: are they staying or leaving.
 - C. Following the event, the block captain will, follow up with the residents that are physically here to determine their status and assistance needed, (i.e., food, water, phone to contact family)
4. If you as block captain are not here you need to coordinate with another block captain those residents you are responsible for.

If you do not want the responsibility of being a block captain but you would like to help in anyway with this committee please come to the meeting

For this to be successful, we need all of your help and participation!

FROM THE GOLF COMMISSION:

“WHO’S UP”?

“Who’s Up”. The big courses have Starters. In AV we have “Who’s Up”. The signs are located on both holes #1 and #10. This is Arcadia Village Golf Leagues way of showing “Who’s Up”.

- ⇒ Only when everyone in your group is present do you put a ball in the “Who’s Up” Pipe. When your ball reaches the bottom of the pipe, your group is up. Remember, EVERYONE in your group must be present BEFORE you put the ball in the pipe.
- ⇒ We are coming to the end of the season and there are a lot of things going on with the golf leagues and special events. Check the Arcadia Villager for the special events. When leagues or special events are on one side, please try to play on the other nine. If you are just out for pleasure, thanks for your help in doing this.
- ⇒ We are seeing some wear on the course with all the play and little rain. This is the main reason we ask that golfers who are playing together. Double up. We love seeing 2 people in each cart. This reduces wear on the course and helps to keep it the most beautiful course in the area.
- ⇒ One more reminder... please fill your divots on the tee boxes.

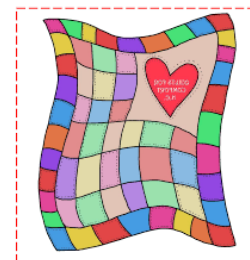

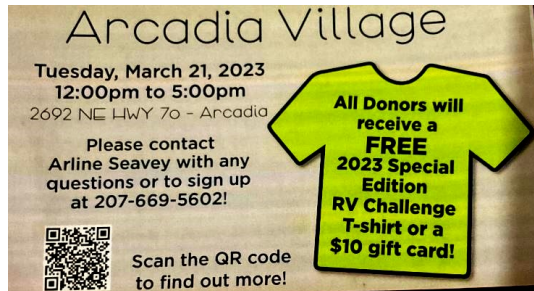

BREAKFAST MORNING GLORIES

These morning Glory Cookies will hold you over until lunch time. They have a multitude of amazing flavors and getting in that oatmeal and great for on the run breakfast. These have been a favorite in my house for the last year, two with coffee and I am thoroughly satisfied.

Yields about 12 Cookies

INGREDIENTS

1 Cup Old Fashion Oats (not quick)	1 Cup Un-Sweetened Coconut Flakes
¾ Cup *Almond Flour	½ Cup *Hemp nuts or Pine nuts or Sunflower seed
3Tbs Ground *Flax Seeds	2 Tsp Cinnamon
1 Tsp Baking Powder	¼ Tsp Salt (optional)
¼ Cup Crystallized Ginger finely diced	3 Banana (starting to brown is best)
2 Tbs Maple Syrup	1/3 Cup Apple Sauce – unsweetened
¼ Cup Raw Pumpkin	¼ Cup Dairy Free Chocolate Chips

INSTRUCTIONS

Preheat oven to 375° F

In a Medium bowl, add all dry ingredients through ginger. In a smaller bowl, smash bananas then add maple syrup, apple sauce, and pumpkin, mix together and add this to the dry ingredients.

Using a round measure cup scoop up 1/8 cup of mixture and put onto a cookie sheet lined with parchment paper or silicone baking mat flatten to ½ to ¾ inch thick round puck.

Bake 17-19 min and edges start to turn brown.

Additions to enhance or individualize to your taste:

½ Cup of Dried Cranberries or Raisins or Dried Cherries or Dried Mango, Dried Blueberry, you get the idea, you can add any dried fruit to step up the flavor.

You can also add nuts or seeds and kick up the flavor. Add ¼ Cup chopped walnuts or almonds or pumpkin seeds as you feel the creativity or have in your fridge.

I actually had Espresso Chocolate chips and used those in one batch and that was a very happy flavor kick.

**If allergic to Nuts, replace Almond Flour with Oat Flour or similar sprouted type flour.*

**If allergic to Seeds remove them, they can be optional. Add dried fruit instead.*

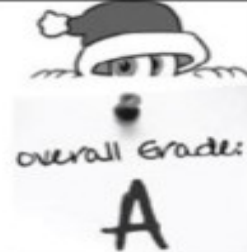

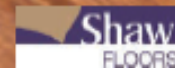

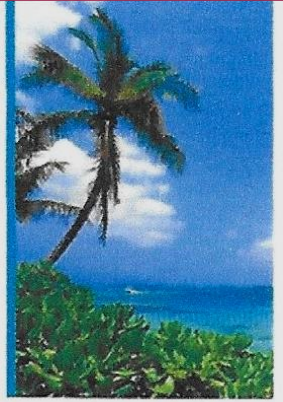
