- YELLOW VISITOR TAGS: Please return any Yellow Visitor Tags to the office.
- **SECURITY NOTICE**: If you see something or someone in the village that does not look right or if it looks concerning, call: Joe Enderby Village Security at 863-558-1656 right away (the office cannot do anything the next day), or during the business week-day the office at 863-494-5669 or the sheriff's office at 863-993-4700. Do not wait. Add these numbers to your cell phone so you have them available when you see something.

RESIDENTS HEADING OUT OF TOWN REMINDERS:

- ⇒ Remember: To contact your neighbor or maintenance person who watches your home while you're away.
- ⇒ Did you verify your house trimming scheduled. Rainy season will be here before you know it.
- ⇒ Remember: If you are vacating your RV Storage Spot for summer, make sure you're scheduled with a person to have your space trimmed.

 Make sure your spot is clearly marked with your LOT Number. The office is not responsible for giving away a spot that is vacant and not marked.

 Do not park in an empty spot not assigned to your lot number. See the office if you would like an RV Spot.
- ⇒ Remember: Put away <u>all</u> outside items that could fly away in a storm.
- ⇒ Remember: Water Shut-Off: Notify the office in advance between 8 am 3 pm Monday thru Friday. Don't forget to turn off your water heater and set your AC & Humidistat.
- ⇒ Reminder: Replace outside bulbs, they should last through the summer.
- ⇒ Remember: UPDATE office with Phone Number and address so you can be reached in case there is an immediate need for us to get in touch with you.
- ⇒ Reminder: Tree trimming is around October. Let the office know if you want your tree trimmed before you leave for the summer.

HOA Annual Members Meeting scheduled for December 9, 2025.

Concerns and Issues surfaced by our Members:

Non-residents trespassing, using our pools and amenities, damage being done to our weight room and other areas.

Non-residents using our roads as a shortcut to the Turner Center and the Mosaic Center; speeders flying through at excessive speeds, placing residents in danger.

Weather Watch Captains (permanent resident volunteers) needed.

While these are not under the purview of the HOA, we all need to work with Ownership/ Management to find solutions. If you are not a member, you have NO voice through the Home Owners Association! This is OUR community, let's work together!

We now have our volunteers for our rent committee, who will be negotiating on behalf of our members with ownership for rent increases for 2026 and 2027!

2026FL statue deems, with an HOA, owners have limitations as to lot rent increases, <u>whereas</u> <u>without an HOA, owners have no ceiling nor frequency regarding rent increases.</u>

The HOA has a rent committee, that works and negotiates lot rent increases, based on comparables in similar parks.

In Statute 723, the Association has the power to negotiate for, acquire, and operate the mobile home park on behalf of the mobile homeowners.

ALL: Your 2025 dues of \$10.00 is due and can be paid to any member of the Board of Directors. Also get your 2025 Membership Cards.

Let's spread the word, ignore the Negative Nellies, that our HOA gives us the voice with Owner-ship/Management to suggest solutions to keep our Community a good place to live!

Time flies. Snowbirds soon will be flying north, but it feels like they just arrived. Everyone, have a great summer.


Starting this month and in the following months, I will be including some rules of the golf course in the newsletter.
