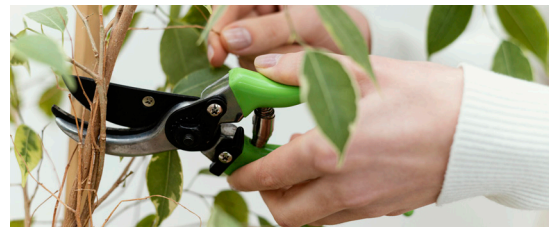

- » **Parking:** Please keep vehicles in your driveway or at the Clubhouse. **Street parking and parking on empty lots is limited to 4 hours maximum.**

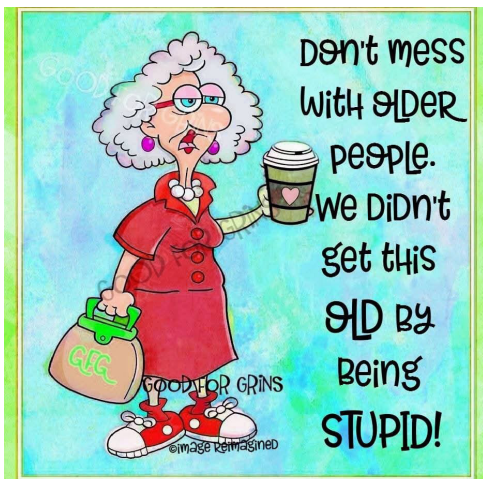

HOA MEETING & UPDATES

From your HOA Board of Directors:

We all know the rumors and misinformation are running rampant throughout our community. Over the last few weeks, even more disturbing false information has been directly targeted toward groups or people, including the HOA.

The Board would like to address recent misinformation being shared within the community. Some statements currently circulating are inaccurate and do not reflect the facts. The Board tries to actively communicate important updates and information through official channels. We are aware of posts that contain negative or inaccurate information. While everyone is entitled to their opinion, we encourage all residents to verify before drawing conclusions or sharing details.

Our community shares serious concerns about recent developments involving Legacy, and other Legacy type community owners. Exploring legislative solutions from the top down is an important step in helping control future price controls that protect residents.

HOA Compensation or Free Service

The HOA Board of Directors is strictly a volunteer commitment. **There is no compensation financially or in other form from Legacy, Blue Stream or any other source, to any Board Member.**

Blue Stream

Back in August 2025, the HOA Board was notified that Blue Stream would be installed in the park. We were also informed; that this would be Bulk Agreement, meaning everyone in the park would have to install this utility. It was not an option. The business decision was made to proceed with the installation this. On September 3, 2025, several HOA Board Members, Village Management, and two other village residents not associated with the HOA, traveled to Coral Springs Blue Stream office where a presentation was given about Blue Stream and what was going to happen going forward. The HOA was requested to sign an

Agreement between Arcadia Village and the HOA, regarding the Amendments to the prospectuses. This amendment stated: *Bulk video and bulk internet, if subsequently offered by the community, the cost of bulk video and cost of bulk internet shall be charged monthly as a separate charge not included in the base rent as part of the lot rental amount, as defined in Section 723.003(6), Florida Statute. The monthly charges on Effective Date are \$40.00 per month for bulk video and bulk internet.*

On September 9, 2025, a special town hall meeting was held with Blue Stream Representatives and Village Ownership, where the same presentation was made to residents. This meeting was also zoomed out to all residents, unable to attend in person. On December 9, 2025, at the Annual HOA Board Meeting, Blue Stream was a noted topic. Under Florida 723.037(3), specifically addresses bulk services:

- *The park owner may charge residents separately for bulk services (e.g., cable, internet), but:*
- *The service must be provided to all residents*
- *The charge must be disclosed*
- *It must not include kickbacks or undisclosed profits*
- *Requires 90-day notice for increases or new charges tied to bulk agreements*
- *We were all informed that the basic package would be \$40.00 per month, which included internet and cable TV channels. What we did not have until recently, was costs related to upgrade packages.*

On February 3, 2026, at the HOA Board Meeting, once again, Blue Stream installation and status was shared. This update was given by Sylvia Clay and was also presented via zoom to those unable to attend. It was requested by HOA members that Blue Stream representatives return to give an update on install timelines and take questions. An attempt was made to schedule this in March, and it was requested that this meeting be held in the morning. The March meeting unfortunately was not held due to schedule conflicts with Blue Stream, but we continued to request this meeting along with package upgrade pricing information.

On April 7, 2026, a Town Hall meeting was held with Blue Stream where a presentation was given by them. The

effectiveness of this meeting was questionable, and pricing information was not presented at this meeting. However, it was stated during the presentation that internet speed of \$40.00 package would be 600 Mbps. After the meeting, the HOA requested clarification on this, as it was our understanding minimum speed would be 800Mbps. On April 8, 2026, we received information that minimum speed would be 800 Mbps not 600 Mbp.

So, to address the social media misinformation that some residents are posting:

- There is NO contract between the HOA and Blue Stream.
- Contracts are between Blue Stream and Legacy/Arcadia Village.
- There are no financial or other compensation incentives between Blue Stream and the HOA
- Blue Steam implementation has been ongoing since September 2025 and is not a new issue as some claim. As noted above, there has been two Blue Stream meetings with residents and two HOA meetings, where Blue Stream implementation was thoroughly discussed.

HOA Training

Recently, the Board of Directors received an email and a registered letter from a past board member requesting copies under Florida 720 as it relates to HOA board members compliance of certification of training, that went into effect in 2024.

Florida Statute 720 governs HOA's in communities with deeded lots/homes, not mobile home parks. In general, 720 applies to deed-restricted communities, HOA's with mandatory membership and property owners.

Florida Statute 723 governs mobile home parks and is a separate statute. 723 has no provisions adopting 720 training requirements and does not cross reference 720 for board education. 723 does not currently mandate formal state-certified training for board members. However, board members are expected to understand 723 and governing documents and certify such.

In addition, while not required under **Chapter 723**, several Board of Directors voluntarily registered for this training and completed the training in January, others are scheduled to attend in April and May. This State approved Board Certification Training 723 Mobile Homeowners' Association Board Training, is approved by the Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation.

723.0781 Board member training programs

(1) *Within 90 days after being elected or appointed to the board, a newly elected or appointed director shall certify by an affidavit in writing to the secretary of the association that he or she has read the association's current articles of incorporation, bylaws, and the mobile home park's prospectus, rental agreement, rules, regulations, and written policies; that he or she will work to uphold such documents and policies to the best of his or her ability; and that he or she will faithfully discharge his or her fiduciary responsibility to the association's members.*

(2) **In lieu of this written certification**, within 90 days after being elected or appointed to the board, the newly elected or appointed director may submit a certificate of having satisfactorily completed the educational curriculum approved by the division within 1 year before or 90 days after the date of election or appointment. The educational certificate is valid and does not have to be resubmitted if the director serves on the board without interruption.

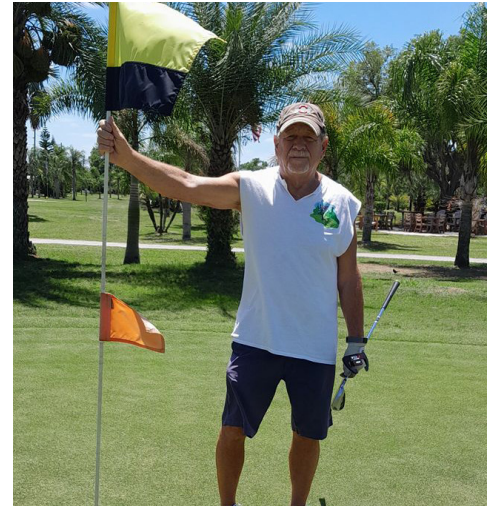

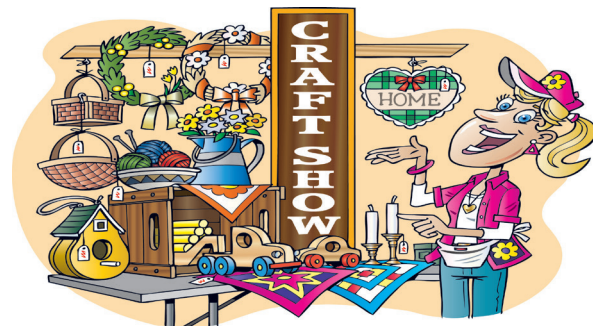

RECIPES

Grilled kebabs make a flavorful addition to any backyard barbecue

Grilling enthusiasts are always on the lookout for something new to cook over an open flame. While traditional staples like steaks, hamburgers and hot dogs will never lose their favor among lovers of grilled food, expanding one's grilling repertoire can open doors to new flavors and ensure meal time is always something to look forward to. Fans of foods cooked over an open flame who want to try something new and flavorful can try this recipe for "Grilled Pork and Mango Kebabs With Chili Sauce"

Grilled Pork and Mango Kebabs With Chili Sauce Makes 4 Servings

For the chili sauce:

- 1/2 cups rice wine vinegar
- 1 tablespoon sesame oil
- 1 tablespoon fish sauce
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon caster sugar
- 2 red chilies, sliced

For the kebabs:

- 2 tablespoons whole grain mustard
- 1 cup pineapple juice
- 1 lime, juiced
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon freshly ground black peppercorns



- 1 1/4 pound pork tenderloin, trimmed of silver skin and cut into chunks
- 1 large ripe mango
- Olive oil, for brushing
- 1 handful small mint leaves

1. For the chili sauce: Whisk together all the ingredients for the chili sauce in a small saucepan. Warm over a low heat, stirring until the sugar and salt have dissolved. Set aside until needed.

2. For the kebabs: Preheat a grill to a moderately hot temperature.

3. Stir together the mustard, pineapple juice, lime juice, salt, and pepper in a large mixing bowl. Add the pork, stir well to coat, and set aside until the grill is preheated.

4. In the meantime, halve and pit the mango. Cut away the skin before cutting the flesh into cubes.

5. Thread the pork onto the skewers, alternating with the mango flesh. Brush the grates of the grill with some olive oil.

6. Lay the kebabs onto the grill and leave to cook, turning occasionally, until the pork and mango are lightly charred all over, about 8 to 10 minutes.

7. Remove from the grill to a plate and let rest for 5 minutes, covered loosely with aluminium foil.

8. Scatter with mint leaves and serve

with the chili sauce on the side.
